He also trained in the Siqueira-Neto Lab at the UCSD Center for Discovery and Innovation in Parasitic Diseases, validating candidate molecules against the parasitic diseases T. Cruzi and Leishmania.

At UCSF Brent's work aims to use deep sequencing and molecular epidemiology techniques to understand the emergence and persistence of mutant and partially drug resistant Malaria within Uganda. He aims to combine sequence data and modeling techniques to better describe the trends of Malaria partial drug resistance for a variety of genes.
